GIZ profile


- Established on 1 January 2011, GIZ brings together under one roof the long-standing expertise of DED, GTZ and InWent.







GIZ CC adaptation support in **ASEAN**





- Inter-ministerial NAP training

2017-18

- Mainstreaming activities in the health, tourism and human settlement sectors
- M&E framework
- Sub-national activities in 4 pilot areas → assess the risk profile of provinces/delimited areas




NAP activities in Thailand, 2015-16
