Report on National Stakeholder Workshop for Bhutan Malé Declaration Project National Environment Commission Thimphu, Bhutan 28 April 2008

The National Stakeholder Workshop under the Malé Declaration Project was organised by the National Environment Commission as the National Focal Agency and Implementing Agency in Bhutan. The workshop was organised at the Royal Institute of Management, Semtokha in Thimphu Bhutan.

The meeting was attended by 31 participants representing various stakeholder groups related to air quality in Bhutan. The list of participants is included in Annex I of this report. Annex II contains the Agenda of the workshop.

Opening Session

The meeting was opened with statements from the Mr. Sonam Yangley, Director, National Environment Commission and Mr. Ingarra, UNEP Ms. Jigme Zangmo, NEC delivered a vote of thanks to the Director, Mr. Ingararasan and the participants.

Session I: Regional Activities and Malé Declaration

Mr. Iyngararasan UNEP, presented Activities under the Malé Declaration with regard to air pollution and the regional arrangements for action regarding air pollution in the region. He also presented an overview of the status of monitoring in each country and also introduced salient features of proposed Phase IV of the Male Declaration project.

Mr. Nedup, Private Consultant, who was the erstwhile project manager for the Male Declaration Project at NEC made a presentation on activities in Bhutan with regards to Male Declartion since 1992. He also touched on the institutional arrangements within Bhutan for the project.

Mr. Iyngararasan UNEP, made a presentation on the Atmospheric Brown Cloud and how it relates to global and regional air pollution issues.

Mr. Harry Vallack, Stockholm Environment Institute, made a presentation on Emissions Inventories under the Malé Declarationcovering the gasses covered, the methodology and a quick overview of the workbook.

A discussion session followed the two presentations where participants sought clarification on certain aspects such as links with other Multilateral Environmental Agreements, the crop impact studies, and data sharing, and opportunities for capacity building to enforce air pollution regulations.

Session II: National Activities related to Air Pollution

Mr. Thinley Namgyel made a presentation on activities conducted by the NEC with regards to air quality studies and management issues and policies in Bhutan. He also presented the recently adopted standards for ambient air quality, industrial emissions and noise and workplace emissions in Bhutan.

Mr. Karma Pemba, Road Safety and Transport Authority presented on the program of vehicle emissions monitoring, and standards in Bhutan.

Ms. Anjana Giri, GEF Small Grants program, UNDP Bhutan made a presentation on improved cooking stoves in institutions,

A discussion session followed where participants discussed the types of vehicles to be covered for monitoring including armed forces, the growth of vehicle numbers, the need for better mass transportation,

Discussion on information sharing & networking for air pollution monitoring in Bhutan"

Under this session participants made few suggestions on information sharing and networking.

- 1. The role of NIA and NFP needs to be clear. Suggestion to use the hydrometeorology agencies in this project was also made. At this stage, only one station is used for the project in Gelephug, Bhur station.
- 2. The RSTA also highlighted the need for a unified software for collecting data on emissions testing. As the software is not compatible among the prvate agencies collecting data and the data compiling agency. Some assistance was requested from UNEP to help with this so data could be easier to collect and share.
- 3. The Thimphu City Corporation suggested a monitoring of methane emissions and other gases from the landfill sites, as the landfill for Thimphu has outgrown its capacity and there is a lot of emissions from self combution of gases as well as other non visible gases.
- 4. There was also a question of if there is a component on increased awareness of air pollution issues in Phase IV.
